TTC Streetcar Track Renewal on Broadview Avenue from Danforth Avenue to Gerrard Street East

Contract: 23ECS-RD-08SP

Start Date: July 4, 2023 End Date: November 2023

The City of Toronto and Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) will be renewing the aging-streetcar tracks on Broadview Avenue from Danforth Avenue to Gerrard Street East. This will bring the track infrastructure to a state of good repair. Work will include road resurfacing and repairs to damaged sidewalks and curbs on Broadview Avenue and road reconstruction on Montcrest Boulevard. Construction work along Broadview Avenue will be completed in the four phases:

The streetcar track renewal on Broadview Avenue will be carried out in several phases:

Phase 1 July 4 to early August	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replacement of streetcar tracks between Gerrard Avenue and Sparkhall Avenue • Reconstruction on Moncrest Boulevard
Phase 2 Mid-August to late September	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replacement of streetcar tracks between Danforth Avenue and Sparkhall Avenue • Intersection at Danforth Avenue (after Taste of Danforth)
Phase 3 Early October to late- November	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resurfacing on Broadview Avenue from Danforth Avenue to Gerrard Street East

Construction Update Notices will be issued before each phase of work takes place with further details.

The TTC will also be renewing the streetcar tracks on Broadview Avenue, north of Danforth Avenue to Erindale Avenue and inside Broadview Station. This work is scheduled to take place starting in late August/September concurrent with construction south of the Danforth to minimize the overall duration. A separate notice will be provided with details by the TTC and posted to ttc.ca/broadviewconstruction

Once construction starts, travel lanes will be reduced to ONE NORTHBOUND LANE ONLY from Gerrard Street East to Danforth Avenue.

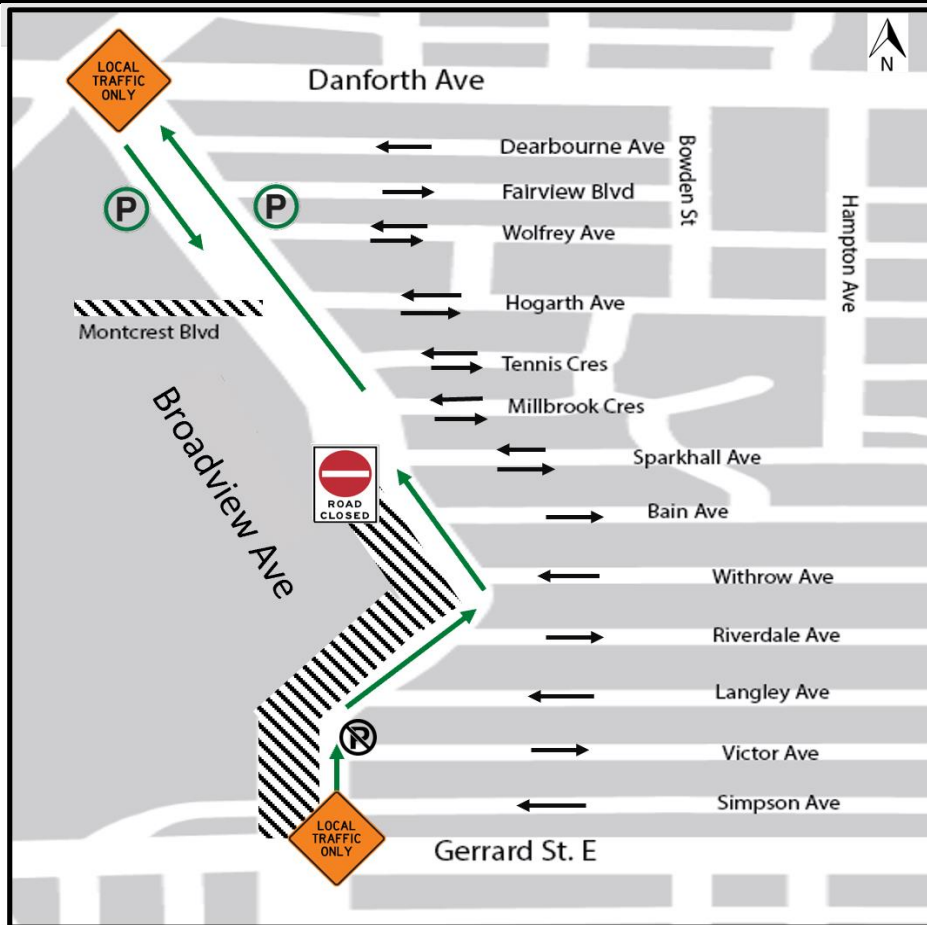
Access from Danforth Avenue, travelling southbound on Broadview Avenue will continue for local access to businesses and residences from early to mid July.

The City and its contractor will be undertaking a number of measures to help manage traffic flow in the area, including modifying signal timing, using real time video monitoring and electronic message boards, and having traffic agents and pay-duty officers. Signs will be posted ahead of the construction zone to direct vehicles and cyclists.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2023 Capital Works Program.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work on this project can take place 24 hours 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day.</p> <p>Concrete breaking activities will mainly occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. Concrete breaking work is the most disruptive and will typically last the first 1-2 days for each phase of the construction. Around-the-clock work during rail installation by TTC is required to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding/grinding.</p>
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Pre-Construction Inspection: PCS Management Inc., under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all homeowners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction.

Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.



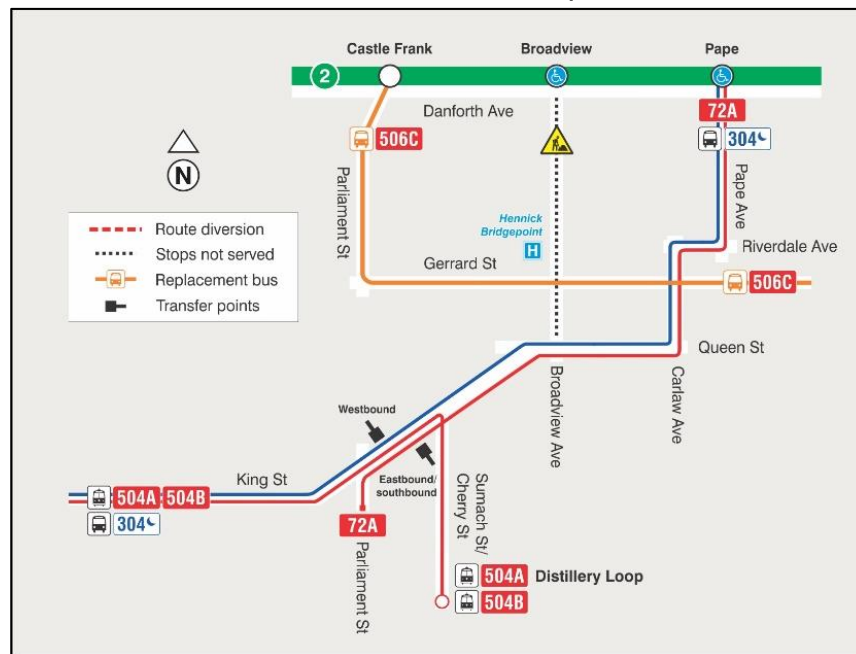
Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all road users. Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this work.

- Travel on Broadview Avenue will be limited to ONE NORTHBOUND LANE ONLY from Gerrard Street East to Danforth Avenue.
- Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.









TTC Service Changes effective June 18, 2023 to November 2023

- Starting June 18, there will be no TTC service on Broadview Avenue between Broadview Station and Gerrard Street due to construction. **504 King and 505 Dundas will not service Broadview Station.**
- 504 King and 505 Dundas buses will return on Broadview Avenue to Broadview Station once traffic lanes have reopened.

 	<p>Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Laneways: Laneways and driveways that serve businesses in the area will remain accessible for deliveries or service.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will affect on-street Pay and Display (metred) parking. Parking will not be permitted, as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please contact us at the information listed below.</p>
	<p>Deliveries: The City will be working with affected properties within the construction zone on arrangements for deliveries.</p>
	<p>Broadview Avenue businesses will be open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine and shop.</p>
